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Miami Dade College Receives \$50,000 from Wal-Mart Foundation to Implement Scholarship America's® Dreamkeepers Emergency Financial Assistance Program

National initiative addresses high dropout rates among community college students

MIAMI, FL (August 8, 2008) – Scholarship America today announced that Miami Dade College will receive a grant of \$50,000 from the Wal-Mart Foundation. The grant will allow Miami Dade College to execute a Dreamkeepers Emergency Financial Assistance program.

Part of a \$500,000 grant from the Wal-Mart Foundation to Scholarship America, the program is being piloted at Miami Dade College and other community colleges and universities around the country to address the high dropout rates of college students when faced with an unexpected crisis, such as medical expenses, job loss and other financial emergencies.

"Wal-Mart is making a significant commitment to educational access," said Wal-Mart Foundation president, Margaret McKenna. "We believe that our support will help many determined students overcome obstacles to completing their education."

"We are pleased to announce that, through support from the Wal-Mart Foundation, the Dreamkeepers program will be introduced at seven additional colleges across the country, including Miami Dade," said Dr. Clifford L. Stanley, president and CEO of Scholarship America. "Our program has delivered drastic results that have provided positive life-changing outcomes nationwide."

A team of Scholarship America representatives will provide on-site support and training to help Miami Dade College determine applicant guidelines, how to create awareness, and develop best practices to raise additional funds for the program.

Developed in 2005 with support from Lumina Foundation for Education, the Dreamkeepers program provides students with emergency funding to allow them to remain in school and obtain a post-secondary education.

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“The Dreamkeepers program and Miami Dade College form a perfect match as they’re both dedicated to keeping students’ dreams alive,” said Eduardo J. Padrón, president, Miami Dade College. “Dreamkeepers is the wisest investment imaginable in students’ lives and the growth of our community.”

Scholarship America currently administers the program at 11 community colleges. In its first two years, the program provided nearly \$595,393 to 1,566 students - easing student worries about housing, food, utilities, tuition, books, transportation, child care and medical needs.
