As vice chair of the Clinton Foundation, Dr. Clinton provides vision and expertise to flagship programs like the Clinton Global Initiative, a model for public-private partnerships to address today's most pressing challenges; Too Small to Fail, which supports families with critical resources to promote early brain and language development; and the Clinton Global Initiative University

(CGI U), a global program that empowers student leaders to turn their ideas into action. Dr. Clinton also serves as the vice chair of the Clinton Health Access Initiative, which has helped over 21 million people in more than 70 countries access critical HIV/AIDS medications, and works across more than 125 countries around the world to build and strengthen sustainable health systems.

In addition to her Foundation work, Chelsea teaches at Columbia University's Mailman School of Public Health. She has written several books for young readers, including the bestselling *She Persisted* series. She is also the co-author of *The Book of Gutsy Women* with her mom Hillary Rodham Clinton, and the two star-in and executive produce the adapted, critically-acclaimed series GUTSY on Apple TV+.

Chelsea holds a Bachelor of Arts from Stanford, a Master of Public Health from Columbia's Mailman School of Public Health, and both a Master of Philosophy and a Doctorate in international relations from Oxford University. She lives with her husband Marc and their children Charlotte, Aidan and Jasper in New York City.

## What your dollars mean to students

#### \$50,000:



Four years of tuition, room and board at a public, in-state university (\$54,860 on average). This donation level means putting a student like <a href="Sara">Sara</a>—a Syrian-born refugee now pursuing pre-med study—through college with no debt.

#### \$25,000:

<u>Leila</u> began her higher education at community college, earning an associate's degree before transferring to Stanford for her junior and senior years. A donation of \$25,000 cuts the cost of Leila's degree in half.



#### \$10,000:

The average student at a public four-year college pays just over \$11,000 per year in room and board. A \$10,000 gift means that student has a year of food and housing security on campus rather than struggling to make ends meet (as nearly half of college students do).

#### \$5,000:



A gift of \$5,000 can nearly eliminate the average annual loan burden for a student—and that's vital for <u>families like the Palombos</u>, whose ten siblings lost their dad on 9/11, and who relied on the Families of Freedom Scholarship Fund to get through college. (Today, Joe Palombo gives

back as a member of Scholarship America's Board of Trustees.)

#### \$2,500:

Based on <u>current data</u>, students pay an average of \$1,200 to \$1,500 per year just for textbooks and other necessary supplies. A \$2,500 donation means not worrying about textbook costs for two full years.
